What: The Wapichan people are seeking legal title to 2.8 million Ha, including 1.6 million Ha

of community conserved forest over old growth tropical forest in the Upper Essequibo Basin. In 2015 the Wapichan called on the State of Guyana to enter into formal talksd on their land and territorial claim that has been pending and unresolved for 50 years since independence from Britain. The President of Guyan has agreed to start talks, but has so far delayed and this event on 4 March aims at highlighting these issues

and at keeping up momentum nationally and globally.

the Saramaka v Suriname judgement from 2007.
